Eleanor Steber Jack Jarzavek, speaker



The career of the great American soprano Eleanor Steber encompassed 22 seasons at the Metropolitan Opera, where she premiered three works this country as well as a world premiere. She also sang to great success in Bayreuth, Vienna, and Munich.

Steber was trained at the New England Conservatory, and was catapulted to fame as a winner of the 1940 Met Auditions. She was known for her mastery of Mozart's operas, but she was equally at home in works by Strauss, Puccini, Verdi, Berg, and Schoenberg as well as in an extensive repertoire of art songs. Jack Jarzavek will explore the full range of her operatic repertoire, using off-the-air broadcast material. His talk will also cover the high points of her life and art.

Directions and parking:

The Coolidge Corner Branch Library is located a block and a half from Coolidge Corner on Pleasant St., which is the street directly across Beacon St. from the Post Office.

From the west: Take Beacon St. toward Boston. After the intersection of Harvard and Beacon take first left across trolley tracks and left on Beacon St. and immediately get into the right lane. Take first right onto Pleasant St. (You'll see the Boca Grande restaurant straight ahead as you begin to turn right). The library is a short distance on the right.

From the east (Boston): Take Beacon St. west through Kenmore Square. You will pass a Holiday Inn at the corner of Beacon St. and St. Paul St (about 1.2 miles after Kenmore Square). After this intersection, the second right onto Pleasant St. (You'll see the Boca Grande restaurant straight ahead as you begin to turn right). The library is a short distance on the right.

Parking: In addition to metered street parking, there are several parking spaces under the building in the rear. The driveway is to the right of the building as you face the front. Please do not park in the private lot directly across from the front entrance: you will be towed — we keep the phone number of the tow lot at the Coolidge Corner circulation desk for precisely that reason. The closest public lot is on John St. about two blocks away.

Handicapped access: There is one handicapped space on the street directly in front of the main entrance. There is another handicapped space near the parking bays under the library, with a long ramp/sidewalk up to the street and the entrance. This space, however, is near the entrance to the meeting room in the basement, so it should be used for handicapped access to events.

ANDRIS NELSONS DELIVERS DOUBLE SNUB TO BAYREUTH

The Boston Symphony conductor won't be back in Bavaria any time soon after last summer's disastrous falling out with the powers-that-be.

Nelsons has committed twice as much time to Tanglewood in 2017 and – adding insult to injury – he will put on a first Rhinegold with the BSO, possibly the start of a Ring. He will spend four weeks in Tanglewood, and they look jam-packed.

From the press release:

In what promises to be one of the highlights of the 2017 Tanglewood season, and a significant event in the world of opera, Mr. Nelsons will lead the first BSO concert performance of the complete Das Rheingold, the first of the four dramas that make up Wagner's masterpiece Der Ring des Nibelungen.

The performance will feature Thomas J. Mayer as Wotan, Sarah Connolly as Fricka, and Jochen Schmeckenbecher as Alberich, among other eminent and prestigious singers known the world over for their acclaimed performances of Wagner's music.

Mr. Nelsons will also conduct BSO Artistic Partner Thomas Adès's Three Studies from Couperin, on a program with music of Haydn and Ravel, and Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 21 with Daniil Trifonov as soloist. Kristine Opolais joins Mr. Nelsons and the BSO for a performance of Mahler's Symphony No. 4 on a program with Mozart's Violin Concerto No. 5 in A, with teenaged violinist Daniel Lozakovich in his BSO debut; Ms. Opolais will also be featured in a Nelsons-led opera gala program with baritone Dmitri Hvorostovsky.

For his first Tanglewood Opening Night concert, Mr. Nelsons will lead the BSO in Mahler's Symphony No. 2, Resurrection, with soloists Malin Christensson and Bernarda Fink.

Mr Nelsons leads the BSO's season-closing concert, beginning the program with Ives's The Housatonic at Stockbridg, from Three Places in New England, prior to the traditional performance of Beethoven's Symphony No. 9, Ode to Joy.

It's Andris's birthday today. He's 38.

Way to go.
